College Readiness in High School – What does that look like?

Scores needed to be considered college ready in Reading, Writing & Math.

College readiness on SAT, ACT and/or TSI - Why is it important?



- Avoiding having to take remedial classes in Reading, Writing and Math in college
 - This is important because students have to pay for remedial classes and they do NOT count towards their degree plan
- Save time and MONEY while in college

College Readiness in High School – How do I help ensure that my child achieves college ready scores?



- Ensure that your child engages in college assessment enrichment activities - Cafe College, Khan Academy, and Edgenuity
- Encourage your child to take advanced courses: IB, UT OnRamps, and Dual Credit
- Encourage your child to work closely with our college advisors and community partners: Project STAY and Cafe College

Encourage your child to take advanced courses while in high school!!

Why? Free college credit!



IB DP	Earning a 4 or higher on an IB exam (# of college credits awarded is determined by the college/university your child attends based on your child's score)
AP (Advanced Placement)	Earning a 3 or higher on an AP exam (# of college credits awarded is determined by the college/university your child attends based on your child's score)
Dual Credit	Earning a "C" or higher in a dual credit course awards college credit through San Antonio College (# of college credits is based on the course taken)
Dual Enrollment (UT OnRamps)	Earning a "C" or higher in a dual enrollment course gives students the opportunity to accept the college credit through UT Austin (# of college credits is based on the course taken)

College Readiness – What is the difference between AP, IB, Dual Credit & OnRamps?

AP (Advanced Placement)	AP courses are college-level courses that require exceptional effort, time, and commitment. It is an expectation that students who enroll in these courses remain in these courses the entire year and prepare for the AP exam. If a student earns a 3, 4, or 5 on the exam, they qualify for college credit. The number of hours is dependent on the college/university they attend and the score they earn.
IB DP (International Baccalaureate Diploma Program)	IB courses are 2-years in length (11th & 12th Grade) and include papers and IB exams graded by Jefferson teachers (known as internal assessments) and papers and IB exams graded by IB external assessors. IB final exams are given in May and are graded on a 1 to 7 scale, with 7 being the highest. Students have the opportunity to earn college credit by earning a score of 4, 5, 6 or 7 in an IB DP course. Scores are reported in early July.
Dual Credit	Jefferson offers dual credit courses through San Antonio College. Dual credit is a system in which an eligible high school student successfully completes a college course(s) that is paired to a high school course required for graduation and receives credit for the course on both the college and the high school transcripts.
Dual Enrollment OnRamps	Jefferson offers dual enrollment courses through UT Austin. OnRamps offers dual enrollment courses designed by the University of Texas at Austin faculty for high school students to engage in authentic college experiences and for their teachers to deepen their content knowledge and impact in the classroom. Students in OnRamps course have the option to accept or decline their college credit based on the grade they earn.

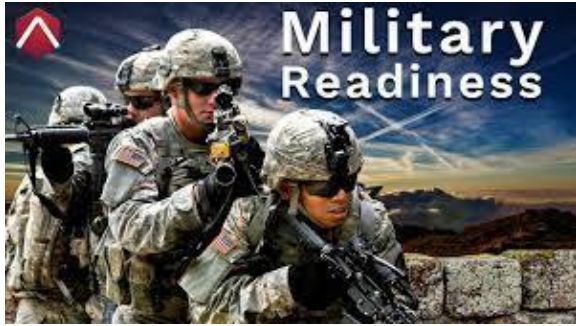
