Course Description

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is an elective year-long course that prepares students for college and career readiness and success using a rigorous curriculum including study groups, motivational activities, and study skills. Students engage in activities centered around exploring college and career options and their own agency. To engage and challenge students and support their academic and personal growth, lessons use writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR).



This course aims to help students.

- Narrow down their college and career aspirations.
- Complete the FAFSA and college and scholarship applications.
- Learn about financial aid award letters and appealing awards.
- Prepare and present a post-high-school plans speech.
- Understand how to choose college courses.
- Improve financial literacy and learn to make a budget.
- Prepare and present a practical skills lesson.

Course Materials

- 1 inch binder (any color)
- · Reading and study material (online OK) when in class
- Recommended school supplies: two sharpened pencils with erasers, two black pens, two different colored highlighters, folder paper, notebook, Post-its, etc.
- Personal hand sanitizer and wipes also recommended.

Course grading.

Students will be graded on a point system and final grades will be determined by the percentage of points received. The following scale will be used:


