Course Summary

Theatre I is a **performance-based** course that will introduce students to the world of theatre. Students will learn basic acting techniques, the role of the actor in interpreting dramatic literature, the historical evolution of performance styles (theatre history), and an introduction to stagecraft.

Expectations

I have three guidelines for my classroom:

- 1. Follow directions
- 2. Do your work
- 3. Be nice

Together we will determine what these rules look like in our classroom.

Coursework and Grades

The breakdown is as follows:

40% - Assessments 60% - Assignments

You will receive rubrics for every assignment/performance ahead of time.

Since many of you are 9th and 10th graders, you will also receive IB MYP grades based on the Luther Burbank IB World High School Assessment Policy.

Assignment Grades:

Warm-ups/Journal Entries

There will be a daily warm-up activity. It could be a journal reflection, a small project, or a questionnaire. Notes taken during class will go into an interactive journal that will be graded.

Character Analysis

As we prepare for scenes/plays, we will work on developing characters. There will be several ways in which we do this: character questionnaires and character biographies, for example. You will need to use your imagination to create your characters.

Memorization

You will need to memorize lines for the scenes/plays you perform. Use the rehearsal time in class to work on learning your lines and you won't have any homework.

Performance Review

You will be asked to watch and review one <u>theatrical or dance performance per semester</u>. Burbank will have several performances that you will be able to attend. You may also see shows at other schools, churches, and local theatres.

This review will be a written paper, at least one page long, that may follow a specific format I will provide you.

If you do not attend a live show, you will have an opportunity to read a play and present a report to the class on the play as an alternative activity.

Participation/Rehearsal

Your participation grade is based on your participation in warm-ups and whole-class and small-group activities. You are expected to be on-task and follow directions for our warm-ups and theatre games/activities/rehearsals.

Rehearsal is time in class for you to practice how you are going to move and speak on stage for your performance. It is an important part of the production process.

Talking to a friend, sitting out, not working with partners as a team, or being on your phone during class are some ways that your participation/rehearsal grade will drop.

Playwriting/Scene Work/ Films

You will be writing one-act plays during the second semester. All the writing activities will be graded and performed for an audience. You will also be performing in and writing short scenes and films.

Assessment Grades:

Projects

During the year, you will be asked to complete research projects on theatre history. Any plagiarism will result in a zero, parent contact, and potentially further administrative action following the Luther Burbank IB World High School Academic Honesty Policy.

Performances/Quizzes/Tests

We will be performing scenes and short plays for the members of this class and possibly for other classes.

You will be tested on your lines through the rehearsal process as well as theatre terms and concepts that we cover in class. Students will receive a test every three weeks and will complete a semester exam for this class which will be a performance.

Tardy Policy/Passes/Food/Restrooms

Please arrive on time and in compliance with the dress code. If the door is closed, you will be marked tardy upon your arrival and will need to sign in on the tardy log located by the door.

Passes will only be issued after the first 10 minutes of class and until the last 10 minutes of class.

You may bring a tightly closed water bottle into class but absolutely **NO FOOD**. Eat before the bell rings and before you come into class. Food found in class will be confiscated.

Phones/Technology

Phones will be collected as you enter class. Students may occasionally need their Chromebooks, but the majority of the written work in this class will be done in an interactive journal.

Classroom Expectations

As a class, we will develop a respect agreement to identify behavior expectations. The students will be held accountable to these standards within the classroom.

Tutoring

My tutoring hours are Mondays and Wednesdays from 8:00 – 8:30 a.m. in room 3217 or by appointment. Please see me for a pass before you attend. My email address is **mwisniewski1@saisd.net** and I am more than happy to look at assignments or answer questions through electronic media.

Students may also attend a one-hour after-school rehearsal to make up class work or missed classes. Rehearsals start at 4:45 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays and at 2:30 pm on certain Fridays.
