Brackenridge Early College High School with St. Philip's College provides every student a rigorous high school and college curriculum. By agreeing to attend our school, it is expected that your child will perform successfully in every high school and college course in which he/she/they is enrolled. These expectations as applicable include, but are not limited to:

- Maintaining a 94% attendance rate for all high school and college courses
- Meeting all TSI readiness standards (Pass TSI- English by the end of 10th grade & TSI Math by the end of 11th grade)
- Passing all high school courses with a minimum average of 70.7
- Completing and passing all college courses with a minimum grade of C
- Maintaining an overall College GPA of 2.0 or higher

All high school and college grades are monitored throughout the year. Intervention and tutoring opportunities are readily available to every student on a daily and or weekly basis. A full review is conducted at the end of each 9 week and semester grading period. Failure to meet any single expectation seriously compromises your child's progress toward meeting their high school graduation requirements and the requirements set by St. Phillips College for attaining their Associates Degree.

Additionally, failure to meet multiple expectations will result in placement on "Probationary Status". Continued failure in meeting the above expectations may result in suspension from enrollment in college courses in the future and/or dismissal from the Early College Program. At that point, your student would be returned to their home campus to participate in a traditional high school curriculum.
