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The TSI test is a collegiate exam that colleges in Texas use to place students in college-level English and Math courses. Students who do not meet these TSI deadlines will not be eligible to enroll in the respective Dual Credit courses and will therefore not be on track to receive the Associate's Degree.

- Early College students must pass English TSI by the end of 10th grade in order to take Dual Credit English and History in 11th and 12th grade. Students who are accelerated in English (meaning they took English 1 in 8th grade and English 2 in 9th grade) must pass English TSI by the end of 9th grade in order to take Dual Credit English in 10th grade).
- Early College students must pass Math TSI by the end of 11th grade in order to take Dual Credit Math and Science in 12th grade.

TSI Passing Score Breakdown

English

 Placement Test - contains 30 multiple choice questions. Passing on this part of the test is a score between 945 and 990.

OR

• Diagnostic Test - contains 48 multiple choice questions. Passing on this part of the test is a score of 5 or 6.

AND

Essay - contains 1 persuasive essay.
Students should write at least 500 words and make paragraphs. Passing on this part of the test is a score between 5 and 8.

Math

 Placement Test - contains 20 multiple choice questions. Passing on this part of the test is a score between 950 and 990.

OR

Diagnostic Test - contains 48
multiple choice questions. Passing
on this part of the test is a score of
6.
