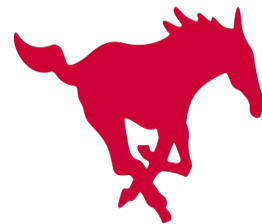

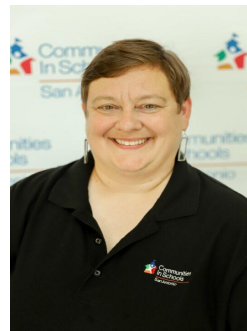

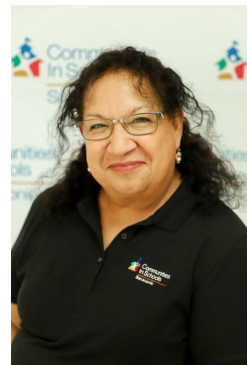

# What is the TSI (*Texas Success Initiative*)?



The TSI Assessments measure college readiness in reading, writing, and math. The scores are used for college placement purposes.

College students in Texas are required to take the TSI Assessment, unless they are already exempt via their SAT or ACT scores, in order to determine their readiness for college-level work.

Why is demonstrating college readiness before entering college important?

- Students who demonstrate college readiness will not be required to take college prep courses in reading, writing and math.
- In order to save time and money on having to pay for and take courses that do not count towards a college degree

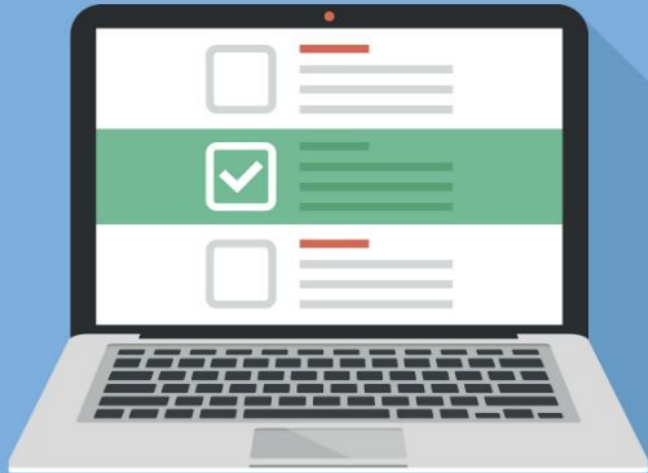

# College 101



## College Application Process

- College applications are open!

What does a complete college application consist of?

- The college application form (online)
- Essays or personal statement ( if required)
- Transcript
- Application fee or fee waiver
- SAT/ACT scores ( if required)

A university will not evaluate an application for admissions unless students submit all five components on TIME.

All communication with students will be electronic, please make sure that students are providing a valid email. Preferably personal emails. SAISD emails expire upon graduation

# What is financial aid?



- ❑ Financial aid is
  - ❑ Money from the federal government or from the state to help students pay for college, career school, or graduate expenses.
- ❑ Types of financial aid (Based on parent/guardian income)
  - ❑ Grants - money that does not have to be paid.
  - ❑ Work-study or employment programs for students
  - ❑ Loans- money that you do have to pay back
- ❑ Scholarships
  - ❑ Merit (Rank, GPA, ACT/SAT scores)
  - ❑ Sports
  - ❑ Clubs

**More than \$150 billion in financial aid is available through Grants, Work Study, and Loans every year!**

# What information does the financial aid application need?



- ☐ Social Security Number & permanent residence number if student holds a permanent residency card.
  - ☐ If parents or students do not have a social security number we can still submit the application.
- ☐ 2022 Tax Returns from Parents / Guardians & Students.
  - ☐ only if they worked and file their taxes
- ☐ Forms W-2 and other income forms for 2021
  - ☐ From the parents / guardians and the student (only if the employer provided the information).
  - ☐ If parents or students worked but do not have W2 we will need an employment verification letter.
