
Higlands Theatre



IITH GRADE PARENT FORUM UPCOMING DATE

March 25th Parent Forum 9-12 pm

- a) If a student fails to attend school without excuse on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year, a school district shall within 10 school days of the student's 10th absence refer the student to a truancy court for truant conduct under Section 65.003 (Truant Conduct)(a), Family Code.
- (b) If a student fails to attend school without excuse as specified by Subsection (a), a school district may file a complaint against the student's parent in a county, justice, or municipal court for an offense under Section 25.093 (Parent Contributing to Nonattendance) if the school district provides evidence of the parent's criminal negligence. In this subsection, "parent" includes a person standing in parental relation. Sec. 25.0951



Credit Denials

Students can **only** have up to **nine unexcused** absences for the 1st and 8th periods or **four unexcused** absences for the 2nd-7th periods. Their credits are denied if the student misses more than the allotted unexcused absences. The student must **make up** what the state calls "seat time."



Seat Time

It is when you can make up the missed hours for being absent. 1 Absence = 1 Hour of seat time. Seat time can be made up during the following timed.

- Twilight School- TSI Testing lab begins at 4:30 pm and ends at 6:30 pm, Monday through Thursday
- Before or after Afterschool Tutoring (See your teacher's tutoring schedule)
- Lunch (ask your teacher if they will allow you to come in during lunch. Just a friendly reminder that teachers are not required to do so)
- Saturday School To be announced on the next newsletter
- 3. You must have work assignments to do at seat time.
- 4. Please get your missed assignments from your teacher(s).
- 5. Any time you stay is counted (ex., 1 hour, 1/2 hour.)
- 6. You can build up your hours. Use the seat time log.

Reach out to your Assistant Principal if you have questions or concerns about attendance issues, including truancy and seat time.
