School Uniform

Orange polo

Dress for success days

We will have dress for success days scheduled throughout the school year. These days are designed to instill in students proper attire for professional venues, such as interviews, college presentations, etc. Students will receive a grade in Path for Dress for Success Days.

SPC College Spirit Days

Wednesdays will be designated SPC college spirit day. Students may wear tee shirts from any college. Khaki or black bottom are still required with tee shirt.

Community Service

Students are to complete community service hours as part of the ECHS graduation requirement.

Hours required for community service cord (worn at graduation)	150 hours by December of senior year.
Where can I do my community service?	You can do your community service hours at any location except for a family member. You cannot be paid for community service hours.
Can I count my internship hours (automotive, culinary and cybersecurity students)	Yes, hours will count towards those required to graduate, but will not count towards those required for the cord. The 50 hours extra required for the cord must be outside of those earned during the internship.

Attendance Reminder

Student attendance is important to the success of your child. If your child is sick, please keep him/her at home and <u>send a note on the day they return</u> to school. We ask that all appointments be scheduled after school. If your child has a doctor appointment and returns to school on the same day as the appointment, make sure he/she brings an excuse from the doctor's office and the absence will not count. In order for the absence to be erased, <u>the student must return to school on the same day as the doctor's visit, and must bring a note and give to Ms. Miller, Data Clerk on the same day</u>. If a note is given later, the absence will count as an excused absence.

Absences Parent Notes

If your child is absent he/she must bring a note from a parent/guardian in order for the absence to be excused. We can only accept eight (8) written notes from parents within a year. After the 8th note, all subsequent absences will be unexcused. All notices <u>must</u> be given to Ms. Miller and will be placed on file for audit. If she does not receive the note, the absence is unexcused.

Power Hour

St. Philip's College ECHS has developed a lunch block/period that is designed to give all of our students a time to eat, catch up on work, as well as hang out with friends. We refer to this lunch block/period as "Power Hour." Research and experience shows that some students need additional support during the school day as it is difficult for them to stay after school for tutoring. Being on a college campus, there are high expectations for our students. We trust them to make wise decisions, be where they are assigned, and finally, we expect them to have some time to relax. Power hour assists students in fulfilling all of these expectations.

During Power Hour students will report to their Advisory, roll will be taken and any announcements or information will be provided. Our official attendance period will be during Advisory, and any student not attending will be marked absent. After advisory, students will have the option of eating lunch (provided by SAISD free of charge or purchased through SPC), relaxing in the Turbon, participating in open gym (if they have the required attire) or utilizing various academic resources, such as Math World, SPC's library, ECHS computer labs, or tutoring (conducted by SPC's learning centers staff or peer-tutoring). Teacher's assigned detention will occur as a component of Power Hour. Students who fail to meet the academic expectations set forth by the ECHS program will be required to attend/participate in the tutorial support provided during Power Hour. These tutorials are meant to provide needed supports for struggling students and not designed to be negative. Our goal is to ensure that all students are successful in our program.
