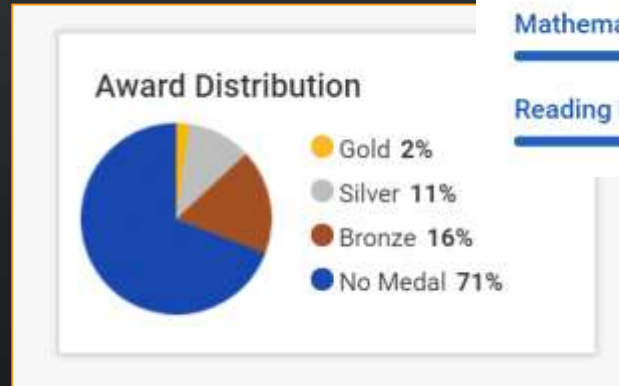

What is the PSAT/NMSQT®?

- Measures academic skills you'll need for college
- Co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation
- Serves as an entry point to National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions and practice for the SAT
- Approximately 3.5 million students participate each year (44% eleventh-graders and 56% tenth-graders or younger)



The same skills are tested on the SAT.

You can try hundreds of practice questions, organized by skill, online in My College QuickStart (www.collegeboard.com/quickstart).

What Skills are Tested on the PSAT/NMSQT?

The test assesses the academic skills that you've developed over the years, primarily through your course work.

These skills are considered essential for success in high school and college:

- Critical Reading
- Mathematics
- Writing Skills

- The total testing time of the PSAT is **2 hours and 45 minutes**, and it includes **139 questions**. This information is broken down more specifically below.
- **Reading Section:** 60 minutes to answer 47 questions
- **Writing and Language Section:** 35 minutes to answer 44 questions
- **Math Section:** 70 minutes to answer 48 questions

Potential for Scholarship Money

- Competition is tough, but students with top PSAT scores can get a significant amount of scholarship money. Of the roughly 1.5 million high school juniors who take the test, about **50,000 students with the highest total PSAT/NMSQT scores qualify for recognition in the National Merit Scholarship Program.**

- Over \$180 million in scholarship money is awarded annually to students who get high scores on the PSAT. Many corporations offer scholarship money as well. In addition, **many colleges offer scholarships to National Merit Commended Scholars, Semi-Finalists, and Finalists.** Some schools even offer a tuition waiver, which can save you tens of thousands of dollars.

T.S.I (Texas Success Initiative Assessment)

What is the TSI?

Is program which determines the appropriate level of college course work for an incoming student. The **TSI test** consists of three separate exams: Mathematics, Reading, and Writing.



What is a passing score on the TSI?

Mathematics: a minimum **score** of 350. • Reading: a minimum **score** of 351.

- Writing: a **score** of 5 on the essay section or a **score** of 4 on the essay and a minimum **score** of 340 on the multiple choice section.

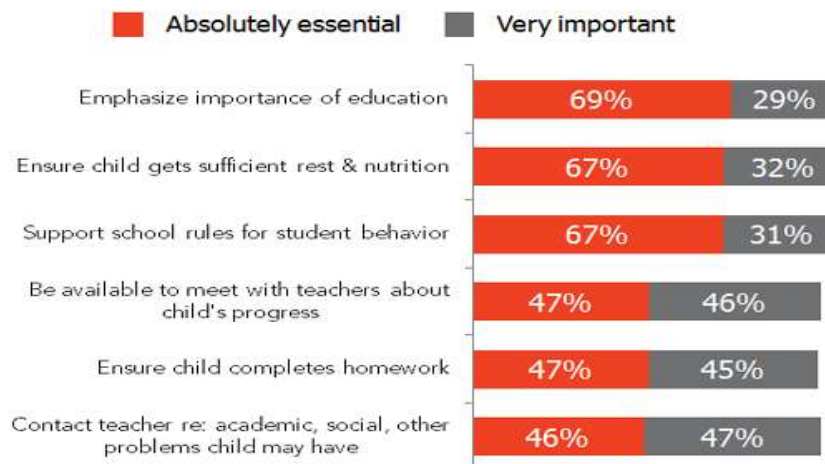

Parental Support

- Parental involvement is known to be linked with improved behavior, regular attendance and positive attitudes.
- Children whose parents stay involved are more likely to have higher self-esteem, be disciplined, have more self-motivation and tend to achieve better grades, regardless of their ethnic, social or racial backgrounds.
- Children tend to achieve better grades and tend to be more motivated when parents are involved.
