10. Display trustworthiness, respect, caring and citizenship

The School Shall:

1. Provide high quality, relevant curriculum (what the student is taught)
2. Provide high quality and effective instruction (how the student is taught)
3. Hold high expectations for students
4. Provide a supportive and effective learning environment.
5. Provide frequent reports to parents on their child's progress
6. Provide reasonable access to staff
7. Provide opportunities to volunteer and participate in the classroom
8. Provide opportunities to observe classroom activities
9. Treat each student with dignity and respect

The Parent Shall:

1. Make sure the child comes to school every day on time and remains until dismissed (via remote learning or in school)
2. Help with completing daily homework
3. Participate in decisions relating to the education of the child, such as school board elections, PTA meetings, school-related meetings and surveys.
4. Attend a parent-teacher conference, at least annually (via zoom or in person once we move forward with opening the school)
5. Volunteer in the child's school
6. Communicate with the teacher if any problems are observed
7. Communicate the importance of studying in school and doing his/her BEST
