This is an exciting year for YWLA! We have completed our 10th year and we are celebrating this year with our Power of 10 theme. We will ask you and our students to realize the potential impact each one of us can have when we team up for a cause. ATTENDANCE REMINDER

Student attendance is critical to the success of our young women. We understand that sometimes students are ill and cannot attend school that day or have appointments and need to leave early or come late. However, we ask that parents pay close attention to their daughter's attendance and try to schedule appointments outside of school hours. State law requires that students be in attendance a minimum of 90% of the days in each semester. YWLA encourages 98%. If your daughter misses more than 4 days from any one class (even if they are excused absences) during any semester, she is in jeopardy of losing credit for that course if the hours are not recovered.

The Gates Scholarship - is a highly selective, full scholarship for Pell-eligible, high school seniors. Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance that is not already covered by other financial aid and the expected family contribution, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Eligibility Requirements: A high school senior, Pell-eligible, A US citizen (national or permanent resident), A minimum cumulative weighed GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale, From one of the following ethnicities: African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian/Pacific Islander American, Hispanic American.

Senior Overnight Trip

All Seniors will attend an overnight trip on September 13th- September 14th. They will tour Texas State University, Southwestern University, Texas A&M University in College Station, and Texas Lutheran University.
