ATTENDANCE REMINDER

Student attendance is critical to the success of our young women. We understand that sometimes students are ill and cannot attend school that day or have appointments and need to leave early or come late. However, we ask that parents pay close attention to their daughter's attendance and try to schedule appointments outside of school hours. State law requires that students be in attendance a minimum of 90% of the days in each semester. If your daughter misses more than 4 days from any one class (even if they are excused absences) during any semester, she is in jeopardy of losing credit for that course if the hours are not recovered.




Kelly Hawkins I am so excited to be at YWLA, get to know your
