Course Description: Students will acquire skills to read like a writer and write like a reader, as they engage in instructional routines that provide voice and choice to their literacy practice. They will closely dissect texts and compositions for meaning beyond the literal, and discuss and emulate author's craft in their own writing. Students will engage in multiple forms of writing: reader's response and notebook entries about their own lives. Students will continue to evolve their reading and writing skills by building soft skills necessary to succeed at the collegiate level and to prepare them for success following high school.
