The new SAISD Parent Portal is an easy-to-use and secure communication tool that allows

parents/guardians to monitor their child's progress in real time:

- View your child's attendance, grades, and schedule
- Contact your child's teacher by e-mail
- Receive alerts and notifications on your phone

All parent/guardians will need to create a new account before the app will work.

Please select New Users/Register to begin the registration process. As you register, please note that all data is case sensitive.

To register and be authenticated, you must enter the following information for one of your children that is currently enrolled in San Antonio ISD:

- Parent/guardian first name
- Parent/guardian last name
- Student birthdate
- Student first name
- Student last name
- Student ID
(Contact campus if you do not have)
- Parent/guardian zip code of home address
- Create a user ID
(maximum 32 alphanumeric characters)
- Create a password
(maximum 64 alphanumeric characters)
- Create a security question & answer
(maximum 150 characters)

If the data you provided matches the data in Frontline, you are automatically authenticated and ready to use the Frontline Parent Portal. Once you have authenticated for one of your children, all of your children will appear under this account if they are connected properly in Frontline.

If there is a data mismatch, the authentication process will fail and you will need to contact the campus to resolve the data error. Once the data has been corrected, you can go online to register and be authenticated.

District employees who have students in the District must follow different login instructions. This category of users will visit <https://tinyurl.com/y5pvgw8j> and sign in with their SAISD email user ID and password. If you have any issues logging in or viewing your students, contact your child's campus to have the Parent Portal flag set to activate your account.

REVISED DRESS CODE POLICY 2022-23



Tops

Students may wear appropriate shirts with sleeves. Students may NOT wear the following: tank tops, muscle shirts, halter tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, crop tops, see-through garments, or anything that exposes the back or midriff.



Bottoms

Students may wear fitted pants, jeans (including skinny and ripped), opaque, yoga style pants, dresses, shorts, skirts, and skorts as long as undergarments and buttocks are not exposed. Short garments must be within three inches of the knee. Bottoms must fit at waist and may not sag. Students may NOT wear pajama pants.



Footwear

Students may wear tennis shoes, boots, dress shoes, and sandals as long as they have back straps to secure them. Students may NOT wear footwear with reinforced steel toes, hard plastics or similar materials, beach sandals, flipflops, or slides.



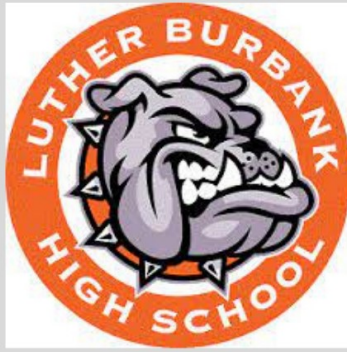
Headgear & Hairstyles

Hairstyles that obstruct the ability of other students to see the teacher and/or hair designs that have profanity or are otherwise vulgar are not permitted. Students may wear hats as long as images on them do not have hat speech, profanity, pornography, drugs or alcohol, or any other images that may create a hostile environment.

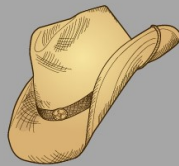
Prohibited items



- Students may not wear clothing with images or language depicting drugs or alcohol (or other illegal items or activities), hate speech, profanity, pornography, violence, or images that create a hostile environment.
- Gang-related attire which may be designated by individual campuses.
- Clothing should not reveal visible undergarments. Swimsuits (except as required in class, field trips, or athletic practice.).
- Accessories that could be considered dangerous or could be used as a weapon.
- Items that obscure the face or ears (except as a religious observance).
