Course Description/General Purpose: The purpose of this course is to prepare students to meet the requirements of U.S. History as determined by the state of Texas via the TEKS, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills. U.S. History is a yearlong study of American history from Reconstruction to the present. Emphasis is placed on vocabulary, critical thinking skills, historical writing, and interpretation of original documents. Students are expected to participate in class through discussions, debates of key issues, and simulations. Furthermore, students are expected to continually develop their writing skills through regular short writing assignments, and maintain a notebook of all class handouts and materials to meet the demands of the STAAR U.S. History EOC exam, which will be taken in early May.

Class Policies:

When absent from class, you are responsible for any missed assignment(s). Students have two school days – from the day they return – to submit any missing assignment(s) for full credit. Missed tests may be made up only before or after school.
