6 Things From 1984 By George Orwell

As you read George Orwell's 1984, please complete the following to show a deepened engagement with the text:

- Define 6 unfamiliar vocabulary terms. Write the word in the sentence, fragment, or line in which it appears in the text. Include a page number and/or line number. Highlight any context clues. Paraphrase the meaning. Include a visual representation to demonstrate your comprehension.
- Record the 5 most significant words and phrases in the text. Using a short paragraph for each, explain why your selected these words and phrases. Be sure to cite a page and /or line number.
- Generate 4 high-level questions about the text. Design your questions to engage the author's "big ideas" or the writer's suggestions and comments about humanity.
- Record the 3 most meaningful quotes or passages from the text. Include a page and/or line number. Compose a high-quality paragraph for each, explaining why you judged this quote or passage so meaningful. Consider author's craft, style, and theme as you justify your choices.
- Identify the 2 most important images, archetypes, and /or symbols. Include a caption and a page and/or line number for each. In two beautiful sentences, rationalize your choices. Construct one sentence for each.
- Compose 1 list of The Top 6 Things to Know About the Text. Cite a page and/or line number for each item that makes your list. Be prepared to rationalize your judgments in an oral assertion.
