




What is Title I?







State Compensatory Education (SCE)





What is State Comp. Ed?

State Compensatory Education is a state program that provides funding to reduce achievement gaps between at-risk students and all other students.

The purpose of the SCE program is to increase student achievement and increase graduation rates by providing supplemental programs.

SCE At-Risk Indicators

For the SCE program, Texas Education Code §29.081 lists the at-risk categories. These categories were decided by the Texas Legislature and included in the law.

The Texas Legislature is the only one that can add or change the categories.

15 At-Risk Categories

1. was retained for one or more years
2. is a 7th-12th grader with averages below 70 in two or more foundation subjects
3. Scored: Did Not Meet Grade Level" on a STAAR assessment
4. is a Prek-3rd grader that did not meet grade level expectations on a readiness assessment
5. is Pregnant or is a Parent
6. had a District Alternative Education Placement in the previous or current school year
7. was expelled, in the previous or current school year
8. is currently on parole, probation, deferred adjudication, or conditional release

SCE At-Risk Indicators

For the SCE program, Texas Education Code §29.081 lists the at-risk categories. These categories were decided by the Texas Legislature and included in the law.

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15 At-Risk Categories

9. was previously identified as a drop-out student
10. is an **Emergent Bilingual**
11. has been in the **care or custody** of the **Dept of Family & Protective Services (DFPS)**
12. is **homeless**
13. **resided in a residential treatment facility**, in the previous or current school year
14. has a **parent** who **is or was incarcerated** in a penal institution during the life of the student
15. is enrolled in a **dropout recovery school**







Educación Compensatoria Estatal (SCE)





¿Qué es la Educación Compensatoria Estatal?

La Educación Compensatoria Estatal es un programa estatal que proporciona financiación para reducir las diferencias de rendimiento entre los estudiantes en situación de riesgo y el resto de los estudiantes.

El propósito del programa SCE es aumentar el rendimiento de los estudiantes y aumentar las tasas de graduación, proporcionando programas complementarios.

15 categorías de riesgo

1. perdió un año de clases o más
2. es un estudiante de 7.^º-12.^º grado con un promedio de menos de 70 en dos materias básicas o más
3. Anotó: "**No cumplió con el nivel de grado**" en una evaluación STAAR
4. es estudiante de Prek-3.er grado que **no cumplió con las expectativas de nivel de grado** en una evaluación de preparación
5. está **embarazada** o es un **padre**
6. tuvo una **Colocación de Educación Alternativa del Distrito** el año escolar anterior o actual
7. fue **expulsado** el año escolar anterior o actual
8. actualmente está bajo **libertad condicional, libertad provisional o sentencia diferida**

Indicadores de riesgo para SCE

Para el programa de SCE, el Código de Educación de Texas §29.081 enumera las categorías de riesgo. Estas categorías fueron establecidas por la Legislatura de Texas y se incluyen en la ley.

La Legislatura de Texas es el único grupo que puede agregar o cambiar las categorías.

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

10. es un estudiante bilingüe emergente
11. ha estado bajo el cuidado o la custodia del Dpto. de Servicios para la Familia y de Protección (DFPS)
12. no tiene hogar

14. tiene un parent que está o estuvo encarcelado en una institución penal durante la vida del estudiante
